Delphic Movement

582 B.C. the first Pythian games took place in Delphi. Theodosius I banned them as pagan games in 394 AD. After many years of preparatory work by J. Christian Kirsch to revive the Delphic idea, the International Delphic Council was constituted in Berlin on 15 December 1994 with representatives from 20 countries. The first Delphic World Congress met in St. Petersburg (Russia) in 1996 and the first board meeting in Tokyo (Japan) in October of the same year. The First Junior Delphic Games took place in Tbilisi (Georgia) in 1997 and the First Modern Delphic Games took place in Moscow (Russia) in 2000.

The Delphic Movement concludes the following **DELPHI CODE** - the basis of the Delphic Movement:

1

The physical and mental health of humankind, of peoples and of cultures is a valuable commodity of dignified human existence.

2

Only those who shape the future have the right to stand judge over the past and the present.

3

The Delphic Movement is an alliance for the future. As a prerequisite for a future to which we can look forward, the Delphic Movement undertakes to secure and further develop the cultural and civil assets of humankind.

4

The Delphic Movement celebrates the human spirit in the form of the Delphic Games and the Delphiads. In musical presentations, the wounds of political adversity are healed, peoples and cultures reconcile their differences and the human spirit achieves peace.

5

Competition of the spirit and intellect among humankind and its peoples unleashes the cross-fertilizing power which enables individual cultures to revitalize each other and to realize the universality of the human spirit.

6

Beholden to the Delphic spirit, the Delphic Movement awakens and promotes the spiritual and intellectual strength of humankind and cultivates, in the form of the Delphic artistic categories and their disciplines, the turbulent Dionysian power of humankind through the order of Apollo.

7

The musical competitions, presentations, exhibitions and the adventure of the human spirit are upheld by the principles of the holy Delphic Grove: γνωθι σεαυτον (gnóthi seautón) and μηδεν αγαν (medèn agan). Know thyself as a mortal and imperfect human being and do nothing which does not hold true to humanity, to nature both animate and inanimate, to the conditions of one's existence and to thyself.

At a Glance Brief Summary

Vision

- To set a practical floor for arts, cultures, education and its protagonists like artists, teachers, jurors, politics, public and private officials, sponsorship, agents, media and communication.

- The Delphic Games were held parallel to Olympic Games in ancient Greece and celebrated one year prior to the Olympic Games for about 1000 years until both games were banned as heathen Games 394 BC
- The Olympic Games for sport revived with the founding of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) 1894 in Paris 1500 years after the ban.
- The Delphic Games for arts and culture revived with the founding of the International Delphic Council (IDC) 1994 in Berlin 1600 years after the ban

- To change our social behaviour based on awareness of other cultures.
- To integrate Art and Culture in the life-long education process.

Identity

What are the Unique Features?

Delphic Symbol

consists of six coloured interlaced semicircles which are designed within a circle on a white background symbolizing the unity between the six Delphic Art Categories – (1) Musical Arts & Sounds, (2) Performing Arts & Acrobats, (3) Language Arts & Elocution, (4) Visual Arts & Handicraft, (5) Social Arts & Communication and (6) Ecological Arts & Architecture.

Delphic Poet

is reminiscence on the ancient Delphic Games Greek poet Pindar. The respective bidding committee appoints a well-known writer or journalist of the host country.

Castalian Spring Ceremony

has to take place about six months prior to the Delphic Games / Junior Delphic Games. Water is the symbolic element. A delegation of the host country travels to Delphi, Greece to deliver water of the holy Castalian Spring, its place of origin, to the host city becoming part of the Opening Ceremony to purify the Games.

Opening Ceremony

should give a bright picture of the arts and cultures of the host country and reflect its traditions, values, and creativity.

Main-Program

include competitions, presentations, exhibitions and short film documentaries

Framing-Program

contains of artist forums, lectures, talk rounds and discussions as well as Gala-Shows – as not being part of judging and evaluation.

Agora

is the Artists' Meeting Point as well as the information and press centre.

Closing Ceremony

should reflect a combination of the artistic skills of the host nation combined with the most exceptional artistic contributions during the Games.

Option

Delphic World Culture Forum (DWCF) needs – similar to the economic world – a recognised strong platform possibly to be held about a half year prior to the Opening of Delphic Games and Delphiads. The DWCF is a gathering of the leaders and responsible personalities of the world in the field of culture, cultural education, tourism, media, politics and business to explore common interests and to establish sustainable contacts among each other. The visiting of the Opening Ceremony of the Delphic Games could be the official closing of the DWCF.



Delphic Journey of Modern Times / 1

Review – until 1994

80s Years

J. Christian B. Kirsch supports singers, dancers and painters. Frequent participation as an observer at international music competitions. His experiences / research lead him to the realization that there are serious differences in training and further education methods between the USA, Europe, Asia and above all Germany.

1984

JCB Kirsch develops a concept to promote further education in music and dance entitled "Olympic Music Games". He presents this concept to Prof. Dr. Hellmut FLASHAR, Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy at the Ludwig Maximilian University in Munich. "What you describe has more to do with the Pythian Games in Delphi than with Olympia" is his comment. The Delphic Games are taking shape.

1988

After two audiences, Her Majesty Sofia QUEEN OF SPAIN advises JCB Kirsch to go to Greece to start the Delphic Movement from there. JCB Kirsch contacts Federico MAYOR ZARAGOZA, Director-General of UNESCO and Juan Antonio SAMARANCH, President of the IOC, who congratulates Mr Kirsch in a personal letter on 16 June.

1989/1990

JCB Kirsch lives, works and does research in Greece – including six months in Delphi. He is a consultant for cultural policy and economics and seeks the advice of personalities such as Melina MERCOURI, Tzanis TZANNETAKIS, Niki GOULANDRIS, Mikis THEODORAKIS and Dora BAKOYANNIS; collaboration with Stavros XARCHAKOS, composer, conductor and politician.

1990

JCB Kirsch is working on a concept for the reintroduction of the Delphic Games and presents the idea to the Greek Minister of Culture Evangelos VENIZELOS.

1991

Contact Dr. Ehrhard BUSEK, Federal Minister of Science and Research in Austria.

1993

Meeting with Jacques TOUBON, French Minister of Culture and Francophonie; Faruk HOSNY, Egyptian Minister of Culture; Dr. Nasser El ANSARY, Chairman of Egypt's National Cultural Centre; Nikolai GUBENKO, Minister of Culture of the Soviet Union and Federico MAYOR ZARAGOZA, UNESCO Secretary General.

1994

JCB Kirsch organizes the Founding Assembly of the International Delphic Council (IDC) and welcomes 57 participants from 20 countries and 5 continents to Berlin's Schönhausen Palace. JCB Kirsch is elected as Secretary General of the IDC.

JCB Kirsch is the first foreigner to give a speech in the Moscow City Duma and stresses the importance of the Delphic Movement for culture, politics and economy. First Delphic World Congress in St. Petersburg, Russia First Board Meeting in St. Petersburg, Russia; patrons:

Meeting with Michael GORBATSHOW in Moscow; JCB Kirsch is elected member of the board of the Russian League for the Protection of Culture.

Second Board Meeting in Tokyo, Japan at the invitation of the National Delphic Council of Japan. At the invitation of the Chinese Federation of Literary and Art Circles (CFLAC), JCB Kirsch travels to China to meet the Vice Minister of Culture. Goal: Establishment of the National Delphic Council of China
